Happy New Year! I hope you and your family enjoyed a restful and joyful winter break. It is hard to believe half our year is complete!



- From weekly to quarterly "fun days"



We are pleased to share upgrades around the district to improve safety for all! The Griffith Company graciously gave back to the RBGUSD community by donating a project to improve parking and traffic issues. Through Griffith Company for Community (GC4C), all labor and materials were provided at no cost to the District! The new parking area and drive-through creates safer alternatives for our families during our busiest times of the day. Thank you to Walter Weishaar for facilitating this project and advocating for us all! We will be hosting a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on Tuesday, January 28th at 9:30 AM, please come out and join us! Finishing touches are underway. Information on the proper use of the area is coming soon!

Another exciting safety improvement will be to our phone system. The new system will allow for all schools and the District office to communicate instantly in the case of an emergency. In addition, each office will have additional phone lines to assist in communication with the community.

Lastly, we have a new gate designated for daycare pickup! In the past, a gate to the RBE campus was left open to allow access for families picking up students from daycare. In order to secure our campus and ensure visitors are accounted for, daycare families will gain access through a wireless intercom and camera system. Staff will "buzz" guardians in for pick up!

Technology

This year we faced a challenge with about 650 units of our chromebook fleet hitting their Google expiration date. This date is typically at the 5-year mark after the unit was manufactured. On this date, Google prevents the device from receiving software upgrades in order to ensure that reliable modern hardware is in the hands of students. Google had a bug in their "final" update for this particular model and it caused a lot of intermittent connection issues with the chromebooks. Fortunately, one of our neighboring districts was able to help! The Panama-Buena Vista Union School District was able to donate 800 lightly used chromebooks. This generous donation not only solved the immediate problems with chromebook connectivity, but also extends the allotted time for our "refresh policy" to take
