This national program recognizes outstanding middle schools that demonstrate strong instruction, meaningful student support, and a positive, engaging school environment. Earning this honor is a rigorous process that requires extensive data and evidence of excellence in all areas.

This recognition is a direct reflection of the hard work and dedication of our entire RBG team.

Congratulations to Mrs. Bussman and Mr. Mejia for their leadership, and to all RBG staff and staff across our district who support our students every day. We also want to extend a heartfelt thank you to our families, whose partnership and support help RBG continue to thrive!



RBE News

Rio Bravo Elementary has had an exciting and successful first half of the school year, and we are so proud of the progress happening across campus! Our teachers continue to focus on strong Tier 1 instruction, targeted Tier 2 intervention, and ongoing data monitoring, and students are thriving as a result. WIN groups, 95% Group literacy routines, and collaborative PLC practices are now fully in place, and standards-based report cards are up and running in grades K–3, with fourth grade coming next year. One of our biggest celebrations is early literacy, over 70% of our TK–2 students are meeting or exceeding foundational reading benchmarks! Kindergarten, first, and second grades have each reduced their “Well Below Benchmark” groups by more than 10% from last year. Third grade has moved from 50% Well Below to just 18%, and fourth grade has increased at-benchmark performance from 36% last year to 64% this fall. These amazing gains reflect the hard work of our students, the dedication of our teachers, and the strength of our systems.

Our school culture continues to thrive, with soft starts, daily SEL lessons, positive check-ins, restorative practices, Eagle Valet leadership, Caught Being Good recognitions, and quarterly assemblies all helping students feel connected and supported. Recess has been extra fun thanks to new pickleball nets and our Board Game Zone, and attendance continues to improve as families partner with us to build consistent routines.

Academic innovation is happening in math as well. This year, we successfully implemented Next Gen Math in both third and fourth grade, giving students deeper problem-solving experiences and stronger standards alignment.

Looking ahead, we are excited to keep growing writing instruction, expand training in Write From the Beginning, increase opportunities for peer observation, and continue deepening SEL and intervention supports. Rio Bravo Elementary is truly thriving because of our incredible students, families, and staff who work together every day to make RBE a welcoming and joyful place to learn. We can’t wait for all the great learning still ahead in the second half of the year!

As we begin 2026, I want to thank our entire RBG community for your continued support and partnership. We wish you all a happy, healthy, and successful new year.

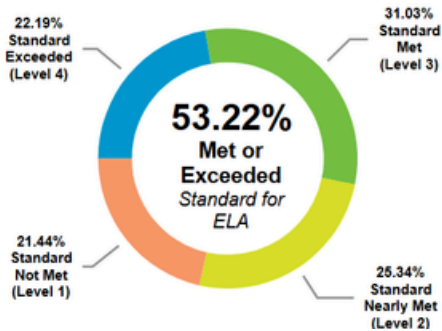

2025 CAASPP Scores Grades 3-8

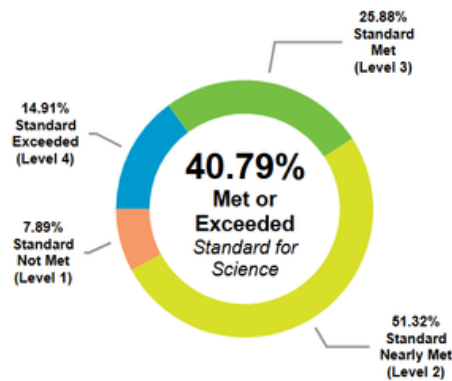

Percent of students within each achievement level

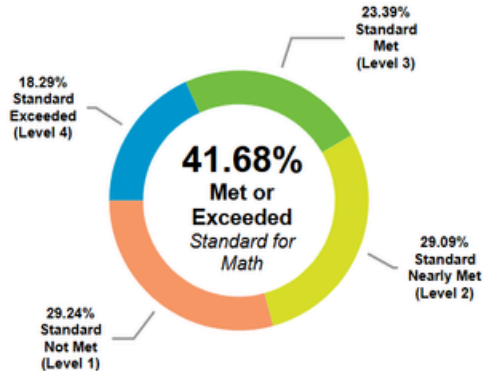


RBGUSD continues to maintain excellent levels of mastery in ELA, Math, and Science compared to the state as a whole and Kern County.

Ed Edgmon Aquatic Center Modernization

We are thrilled to share that, after a long anticipated journey, the Ed Edgmon Aquatic Center modernization project is now in its final stages of completion. This project represents years of planning, collaboration, and unwavering community support, and we are excited to be approaching this major milestone together.

The modernization effort was made possible through a blend of State School Facility Program modernization funds, local developer fees, and a generous contribution of nearly \$50,000 from the Rio Bravo-Greeley Educational Foundation. We are deeply grateful for the partnership and investment from our community that made these improvements possible. By utilizing these funding sources, the project was completed without impacting the District's general operating budget, ensuring that classroom resources remained fully supported while this important facility was upgraded.

As we put the final touches on the project, we are preparing to commemorate this achievement with a planned ribbon cutting ceremony later this year. Additional details will be shared as the date approaches.

The upgraded facility now features a new heating system, enabling extended seasonal use, along with modernized systems designed to enhance safety, efficiency, and overall functionality. Once reopened, the pool will also be available for local high school athletic teams to use for training and practice, strengthening our partnerships with neighboring schools and supporting student athletics across our community.

We look forward to welcoming our students and community members back into this beautifully modernized space, where we can create new memories together for years to come!

At RBGUSD, we know that every day a student is in school is an opportunity for learning, growth, and connection. Students who are chronically absent, missing 10% or more of the school year, may face challenges like lower academic performance, difficulty progressing to the next grade, and reduced social-emotional growth. Regular attendance helps students build skills, maintain important relationships, and stay on track academically. We are committed to working with families to support consistent attendance and address any challenges that may arise. Please reach out to your school if you need assistance!

RETURN WHEN fever goes away over the night and is gone in the morning without the use of medications such as Tylenol®, Advil®

Cold Symptoms

OK TO ATTEND WITH MILD SYMPTOMS

STAY HOME AND SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION for severe symptoms, including a bad cough, difficulty breathing or trouble catching their breath, or wheezing when not controlled by medication (like albuterol).

Skin rash or pink eye

OK TO ATTEND WITH MILD SYMPTOMS.

Repeated vomiting or diarrhea
